DIRECTOR'S NOTE

Myths are engrossing and enchanting. They transcend the borders of our imagination and transport us to fantastical worlds where men turn to beasts and temperamental deities rule over the world, controlling the environmental and political climate. Myths

are the reason we have theatre today! The storyteller has a great deal of responsibility and influence in which stories and how stories are told. Unfortunately, historical events have been distilled to myths, skewed by the power of the storyteller. The events surrounding the original Thanksgiving and the Native Peoples of this land have been recounted for centuries, distilled from its historical accuracy to present a more pleasant and celebratory narrative – after all, we have to teach this to children! Thankfully, and regretfully, we somehow face the facts. Uncomfortable, lamentable, eye-opening facts. What struck me the most when I first read this play – aside from the hilarious wit of FastHorse – is how destabilizing the process of unlearning is. That

pesky dissonance. Ever notice how when we are confronted with the truth, we scramble different parts of what we think we know and piece them together to make sense or to defend the myths we have been holding onto for years? It's not fun – but it is necessary. Unlearning is the first step of allyship. Even after rehearsing this show for months and presenting it to you I still have questions: Who should be telling stories? How do we know for certain that what we are learning or teaching is actually true? What is the responsibility of actual cultural influencers? How am I exacerbating the problem of miseducation? I hope you leave with some questions too - that's the point - and take the space needed to reflect on what it means to be an ally. Now sit back, relax, laugh, and enjoy!

SITE-SPECIFIC THEATRE

We are excited to embrace a site-specific theatre approach to our production of The Thanksgiving Play by Larissa FastHorse. At STW, we are committed to creating visceral experiences for our audience and site-specific theatre can be a great tool to immerse patrons in the story.

WHAT IS SITE-SPECIFIC THEATRE?

Site-specific theatre is the staging of theatrical performances in unique spaces other than conventional theatre venues. These spaces may mimic the setting of the play, be adapted to immersive outcomes, or take advantage of underused spaces or natural spaces.

WHERE IS THIS PLAY SET?

In an high school drama rehearsal space as the characters prepare for a Thanksgiving pageant.

AREN'T YOU PERFORMING IN A CHURCH? HOW IS THAT SITE SPECIFIC?
